Saint John XXIII (1881-1963)

- Nicknamed -- "The Good Pope"
 - Pope from 1958-1963
 - Elected as a "Caretaker" Pope;
 - Proved to be Major Reformer.
- He Called Second Vatican Council into session and commissioned it to "Open the Church to the Modern world".
- He led reformation of the Mass, reintroducing participation by the congregation and reintroducing the vernacular.
- He advocated a strong emphasis on ecumenism
- Canonized 27 April 2014
- His feast day is Oct 11 (day on which Vatican II Began).
- He is also honored by the Anglicans (June 4) & the Lutherans (June 3).

- John XXIII wrote the encyclical "Pacem in Terris", or Peace on Earth. (An encyclical
 is a formal teaching issued by the Pope.)
- Issued during the Cold War just after the Cuban Missile Crisis.
- Diverges from historic practice in that its addressed to "all men of good will" not just to Catholics.
- Addresses the issues of human rights and moral duties of the individual.
- Asserts the need for equality amongst nations, and the need for the state to respect the human rights of its citizens and to be reflective of the moral duties to society.
- Presents the need for greater relations between nations, thus resulting in collective states assisting other states.
- Urges Catholics to assist non-Christians and non-Catholics in political and social aspects.





- Latin Abbreviation for "three days" (in singular)
- Jesus' suffering, dying and rising from the dead
- The Church views this as a <u>single</u> event



7. Pentecost

- Greek meaning 50th day
- The Holy Spirit Descends upon & Dwells in the Apostles
- The Holy Spirit breaths life into the Church



Understanding the Church as an Organization

The Church is organized by Orders (Ranks?) of the Faithful. These Orders are:

- Catechumens (Candidates for Baptism)
- Baptized Laity
- Consecrated Laity
- Deacons
- Priests
- Bishops
- Pope as Prime among Bishops

Deacons, Priests, Bishops and the Pope are known as Holy Orders

Catechumens, Baptized Laity and Consecrated Laity are known as Lay Orders.

We acknowledge one baptism for the forgiveness of sins.

- The Communion of Saints:
 - This reflects the view of the Church as the assembly or fellowship of people sharing in God's eternal life (grace). It includes all the Saints. Saints is a term of art including the faithful believers both living and dead.
 - The Saints Militant are those still alive in this life on Earth.
 - The Saints Penitent or in Purification are those souls in Purgatory, undergoing purification from sin in preparation for heaven.
 - The Saints Triumphant are those in Heaven.
 - We believe that we are all in this together and can pray for each other: The Saints Triumphant can pray for the Saints Penitent & the Saints Militant; The Saints Militant can pray for the Saint Penitent and can ask the Saints Triumphant to intercede for them.

- Catholic understanding of this Book differs greatly from that of Born Again Christians.
- The Book is written in a style known as Apocalyptic which it shares with the Books of Daniel and Ezekiel.
- This style is difficult for 21st century persons to understand because it is full of esoteric symbolism and strange imagery.
- The style arises from a sense of severe persecution; it gives expression to the current suffering of the persecuted and portrays hope for future conditions of redemption and joy in final union with God.

- Born Again Christian interpretation or understanding is that the Book of Revelation:
 - Predicts the exact time of end of the world including the specific events that lead up to it.
 - Predicts the Coming of an anti-Christ who will lead the world astray.
 - Predicts a Rapture (taking into heaven) of all true believers to avoid the Great Tribulation that results from the anti-Christ.
 - Predicts a Great Tribulation (a reign of terror of 1000 years) for those remaining after the Rapture.
 - Proclaims the Final return of the Lord after the Great Tribulation to claim the world for Himself.
 - Predicts a final great military battle of good forces (US?) versus evil forces (Previously the Chinese then the Russians, now the Muslims) that will take place in the Middle East near Israel at the end of time.


